What Churches Can Do

Do: Address the moral and human dimensions of public issues. Share your teachings on human life, human rights, justice and peace. Apply your values to legislation and public issues. Invite all candidates for the same office to a public forum, debate, or candidate night, and treat them all the same. Conduct non-partisan drives on church property to encourage people to vote. Distribute unbiased candidate questionnaires that cover several issues, not just one.

Don'ts: Endorse or oppose candidates for political office by any means, including a sermon, church newsletter, or sample ballot. Distribute or display campaign literature under church auspices. Arrange for groups to work for a candidate for public office. Invite only selected candidates to address your church-sponsored group. Conduct partisan registration or turnout drives under church auspices. Distribute or display a one-issue candidate survey, or a survey that says whether a candidate "agrees" or "disagrees" with a church group's views. Organize or support a political contributions committee under church auspices.

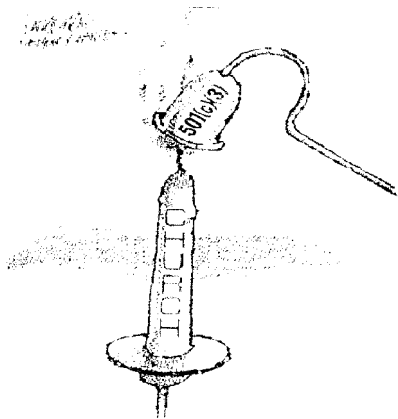
Balaam was the classic fence-straddling compromiser who had learned to have his cake and eat it too. The false

"There is a new breed of trustees out there, who understand their fiduciary responsibilities."

(A personal conversation with Dr. Dixon and some other preachers in the State of Ohio in the mid-eighties)

The office of trustee is not biblical, but rather a corporate office established by state law. Trustees are not trustees for the church, but rather for the state to make sure that the state's property is used for the purpose stated in the corporate charter and the IRS Code pertaining to tax exempt organizations. The chairman of the trustees, along with the other members of the board, have total control of the church with the pastor simply functioning as the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of the Corporation. The trustees have the power to fire the pastor at any time. The argument that they must follow proper procedures as written in the corporation's constitution is a joke. Once the trustees dismiss the pastor, they will go to any means to keep him from the pulpit, including changing locks or calling law enforcement which has happened in the recent past. If the preacher tries to sue, the courts will generally say that internal church affairs is none of the state's business, or simply

uphold the trustees. We have heard of several instances where these things have happened over the past few years. Many of the older preachers understood these things. Dr. J. Vernon McGee said on one of his radio broadcasts that his relationship to The Church of the Open Door in Los Angeles was one of a hired gun so to speak. He was only there to preach. It couldn't be a Baptist church.

Basically most preachers today, even in fundamental circles, in practice operate the same way and love to have it so. They consider themselves as employees. Many file W-4 forms and the church submits W-2 forms to the IRS. Other pastors file as self-employed with the church then filing 1099 forms. We have evidence that the IRS actually considers the pastors as employees just as secretaries, custodians, Christian school teachers, and other non sacerdotal (IRS language) positions such as choir directors, etc. They haven't totally corralled all of the pastors as yet, but they are well on their way. The Methodist Denomination has already lost their case in the courts in this regards, and has totally capitulated to the IRS.

An interesting exchange took place in the case of *US v IBT* on August 22, 2000. Federal Judge Sara Evans Barker asked Attorney Al Cunningham in a hearing for the names of the trustees of the church. Mr. Cunningham explained that the church had no trustees. She said that they had to have trustees, and he said that they didn't. If in fact there had been trustees elected by the congregation of IBT, he would have been obligated to give her their names or face contempt of court. But what if there had been trustees? No doubt the following scenario would have ensued. Barker would have demanded that they meet with her in her chambers. At that point she would have explained their fiduciary responsibilities and would have demanded that they work with the IRS to get the matter settled. The first thing that they would have done was to fire the pastor and then they would have cut a deal with the IRS, and the principle of Lordship that we were standing on would have collapsed, because these men would not put their homes and businesses in jeopardy for the church. But the scripture commands the shepherd, who is not a hireling, to even lay down his life for the sheep.

Does US law mute voices of churches?

More than 130 members of the US House of Representatives want to amend the law that prohibits partisan activity — such as political rallies, fundraisers, distribution of political literature, and direct endorsements from the pulpit — by pastors and houses of worship. They hope to do this by inserting a provision into a bill that is already before a House-Senate conference committee — thus avoiding public debate or votes in either body.

"Nothing is more important than our spiritual leaders having the right to name candidates who stand for protecting morality," says Rep. Walter Jones (R) of North Carolina, the bill's sponsor. The legislation would permit political speech or "presentations" during services or other church-sponsored gatherings.

The Jones bill is named the Houses of Worship Free Speech Restoration Act, but some legal experts say it has nothing to do with the First Amendment.

The preachers and lawyers have been telling us that our main problem is the 1964 change, during the Johnson presidency, in the rules that regulate 501 (c) (3) non-profit organizations in the IRC.

However, just a casual examination of the site will show that it has said basically the same thing concerning what the IRS determines as political activity since the early thirties. The Supreme Court made the same observation in *Bob Jones v US* in the early eighties. There is no excuse for our preacher fathers not seeing the danger of this entanglement with government long before most of the pastors today were ever born. Did they not know the power of contract law? Could they not read when it says that the organization must "espouse federal public policy?" Just because that public policy represented a Christian worldview at that time did not make the agreement right in principle. But apparently the lure of tax exemption and tax-deductible gifts was just too much to refuse, even by men that we would consider giants of the faith. However, they no doubt had their battles to wage for Christ such as modernism, cultism, worldliness and many other things too numerous to mention which many of them waged most valiantly.

IRS tells churches: no politics

The parking lot at First Baptist Church of College Hill was filling up when a worker began telling people to leave.

The political forum at the historically black church would not be taking place, he said. At the last minute, it was being moved to a public library.

Inside a cramped room, moderator Gerald White explained the switch. That afternoon, the pastor had received a letter from the Internal Revenue Service asking about political activity at the church, a stop for many Democrats running for office.

The Rev. Abraham Brown didn't want to hold another political event when the IRS was asking questions, White said.

Why had the IRS turned its attention to this fixture in Tampa's black community? White said the letter sent by the IRS last month asked about a 2-year-old visit by then-gubernatorial candidate Janet Reno.

Jerry Falwell Seeks 'Uprising of Courageous Pastors' for Political Forum

Baptist preacher Jerry Falwell, whose endorsement of President Bush has raised questions about his church's tax-exempt status, is urging pastors and churches to be involved in the political process. This weekend, Falwell anticipates 10,000 ministers to come for a Politics and the Pulpit forum at his Liberty University in Lynchburg, Va.

Barry Lynn, executive director of Americans United for Separation of Church and State, recently asked the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) to investigate Falwell because of a column posted in July on the Web site of Falwell's Liberty Alliance, a nonprofit educational and lobbying organization similar to his defunct Moral Majority, the Associated Press reported.

Titled "Time to Open Wallets for Bush," the column, said: "For conservative people of faith, voting for principle this year means voting for the re-election of George W. Bush. The alternative, in my mind, is simply unthinkable."

IRS tax rules state that churches can speak out on moral issues, but should not favor one candidate over another. Falwell has said he did nothing wrong, noting that his comments were not made under the auspices of his Thomas Road Baptist Church in Lynchburg or other Falwell tax-exempt entities.

After the accusations, Falwell called for "an uprising of courageous pastors in America," inviting ministers to meet Sept. 26-29 for the "Politics and the Pulpit" forum. He said Americans United is using "scare tactics" to intimidate pastors from speaking out on moral and social concerns.

"It is becoming increasingly evident that conservative pastors in America are being targeted for speaking out on political issues that confront our nation," Falwell [said] on his church's Web site.

He noted that Americans United has also filed a complaint against Ronnie Floyd, pastor of the First Baptist Church of Springdale, Ark., after he preached a sermon allegedly promoting the re-election of President Bush.

Meanwhile, the Alliance Defense Fund (www.telladf.org) is offering free legal advice to churches and pastors on how to speak about social and moral issues without risking the loss of tax-exempt status.

In a letter of clarification requested by a traveling minister, the Internal Revenue Service has declared people gathered in tax-exempt churches can't pray for President Bush to win the election on Tuesday.

The ruling comes in response to a request by the Christian Defense Coalition, which is in the midst of a 15-day prayer tour through Ohio and Pennsylvania. The Rev. Patrick J. Mahoney, director of the organization, had planned to lead in prayer for a Bush victory during evening services in each town. Though he had hoped to hold the services in churches, Mahoney says he has used American Legion halls, hotels and other venues pending a clarification from the IRS.

As WorldNetDaily reported, a concerted effort is under way to get the IRS to crack down on churches that might push certain candidates or parties. In July, Americans United for Separation of Church and State, headed by Barry Lynn, filed a complaint with the IRS against Ronnie Floyd, pastor of the First Baptist Church of Springdale, Ark., accusing him of preaching a sermon promoting President Bush's re-election July 4

Where is the Outrage?

Where is the outrage for such demands that these organizations are making? Not because these infidel groups are making such demands — we should expect this from these emissaries of Satan — but where is the outrage from the preachers of America who have sat idly by while Satan has sown tares among the

wheat? The 501(c)(3) contract is clear; all the pastors have to do is read it and then tremble as Eli did when he learned that the ark of God had been seized by the Philistines.

Many preachers still believe that they are protected with the mandatory exemption provision for churches at 508(c) of the IRC, but this is a myth. A so-called 508(c) church is still considered a tax-exempt organization under Section 501(c)(3) even though they don't have to file an application form 1023. However, the church still has to comply with all the rules and regulations of the code, and if it doesn't, the IRS can revoke their tax-exempt status which they have done and will do more in the future.

In essence all of the pulpits of America have been seized by the IRS and yet the preachers for the most part are not concerned. The IRS, by their definition of a church in Publication #1828, has declared the Lord's church to be illegal, totally ignoring the US and State constitutional clauses on religious liberty. Unless the Congress or the courts tell the IRS to stay out of the affairs of churches that do not want tax-exempt status, there will soon be an underground church in America just as in communist countries. But unless a church can demonstrate by doctrine and polity that they are not operating as a tax-exempt organization, there will never be that case. That's what the Biblical Law Center is all about. Through the Declaration of Trust, a church can operate biblically in the real world and yet maintain their autonomy under Christ. Tragically the pastors are arguing over non-essentials while the enemy is preparing the chains for all of the preachers regardless of their affiliation, at least all of those that will not bow. But in the average church, it's business as usual.

U.S. Justice Department: NO UN-CONTROLLED CHURCHES WILL BE ALLOWED IN AMERICA TODAY

Following are the exact words of U.S. Attorney Robert Metzger during oral arguments in the 7th Circuit Court of appeals in Chicago on May 11, 2000 in *US v IBT* — "...The position of Indianapolis Baptist Temple [which]...basically says that it allows no government regulation

unless it voluntarily submits to it is simply an untenable position in society." This statement was repeated again later. This was the real crux of the case. Who will control the church — Christ or Caesar? It has always been the real issue for the last 2000 years.

IRS THROWS AMERICA'S PREACHERS A BONE

IRS PUB. 1828, Pg. 7 Individual activity by religious leaders

"The political campaign activity prohibition is not intended to restrict free expression on political matters by leaders of churches or religious organizations, speaking for themselves as individuals. Nor are leaders prohibited from speaking on important matters of public policy. However, for their organizations to remain tax-exempt under IRC Sec. 501(c)(3), religious leaders cannot make partisan comments in official organization publications or at official church functions.

To avoid potential attribution of their comments outside of church functions and publications, religious leaders who speak or write in their individual capacity are encouraged to clearly indicate that their comments are personal and not intended to represent the views of the organization."

This has to be a modern day example of what Paul was talking about when he said, *"Having a form of godliness, but denying the power thereof: from such turn away."* (II Timothy 3:5) Are not the churches of America in grave danger from the Lord Jesus himself if they do not heed His warning to *"Repent: or else I will come unto thee quickly, and fight against them with the sword of my mouth."* (Revelation 2:15,16)

For those preachers who say that they are only responsible to preach, they simply have no clue as to the biblical definition of the gospel. We cite four examples of how this UN policy is presently applied by local officials who no doubt are not even aware of it. Pastor Kenneth Wilson had to go to court to enjoin the city of Evansville, Indiana from making them get rezoning when they occupied an abandoned church building. They actually sent out prayer police that reported back to the city council that the church was in fact having prayer meetings based on the announcement on their sign out front. The Baptist Temple in Indianapolis had to sue through a second party to get a commercial building rezoned for the purpose of worship. In the process they found that the building could have been used for any purpose, including a liquor establishment or pornographic book store, but not a church congregation. By the time the case was settled, the facility was no longer available. Another Baptist church in a small city East of Indianapolis had to leave the city because of zoning problems and then when they found a location in the country they found that it was zoned agriculturally, and in the end through all of the problems the small church ended up dissolving. However one of the most egregious examples of this conspiracy against God took place in Melbourne, Florida. During the 2-1/2 years that it took Beacon Baptist Ministries to get their 6000 sq. foot building built, a Wal-Mart grocery store down the street and an entire mall a few miles away were completed and occupied.

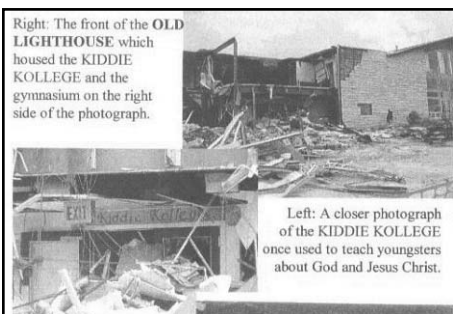

The Night Cometh and May Now be Upon Us

The Lord Jesus said, I must work the works of him that sent me, while it is day: the night cometh, when no man can work. John 9:4. We are now rapidly approaching the time when it will be too late for churches who desire to remain true to Christ to be able to meet in what we have known as church facilities. The Lord's church cannot own property, because to do so requires it to be a legal entity. A New Testament church is not a legal entity such as a corporation or unincorporated association, which are both creations of the state. And at some point in the future, as we move toward the end of the age, churches that wish to remain true to Christ will not even be able to lease property because of stipulations that government will require of owners pertaining to discrimination, etc. Down through history, these things have happened many times, and following is an example from recent history as to how these things can happen.

The Trap Closes

Just as the Three Self Movement developed in China under communism, it has now developed to the same degree here in the U.S. IRS-approved churches must be recognized by the government as having a distinct legal existence, state financed churches through tax-exemption, tax deductible gifts and now the faith based funds, and state propagandizing churches by espousing federal public policy.

In the outstanding account of Watchman Nee by Angus Kinnear in Against The Tide, there is a chapter entitled, "The Trap Closes." It tells how the churches were totally taken over by the government of China through the Three Self Movement. This included official recognition by the Communist government, and support by the government, and in return the church was to propagandize for the state. This is exactly what is involved in the not-for-profit structure in America today. Congress, backed up by the courts, is totally controlling the not-for-profit organizations – including churches – in all of their activities, including content of sermons and finances.

In 1994, the Indianapolis Baptist Temple received a letter from the Regional Commissioner of the IRS Cincinnati that contained twenty-two questions that dealt with every aspect of the internal affairs of the church. Because we did not answer them, the IRS officially removed our tax exemption, which we had relinquished twelve years before. However, if we had not answered them, the result would have been the same, as it was with The Church of Pierce Creek in Vestal, N.Y.

In listening to recent congressional hearings on campaign reform, there is no doubt, at least in my thinking, that every church in the U.S. will receive a prototype of this questionnaire in the future, probably on an annual basis, or their tax-exemption will be removed. The questions included the following: a report of daily activities, provision of all corporate or internal instruments if the church is or is not incorporated, all sources of income over \$100, current board members, current pastors and staff, all alms-giving above \$100 to the poor by name, a list of love gifts to evangelists and missionaries,

list of all real estate, a list of all fund-raising activities including submission of all pertinent documents, a list of laws or public policy with which the pastor advocated non-compliance, and a list of any intervention in the political or legislative process. Even if the pastor refuses to answer these questions, the trustees or official board has the fiduciary responsibility to complete them. To refuse will be to lose tax exemption, but to answer them is to submit the internal affairs of the church to the control of the IRS. IRS Agent Testifies Under Oath That Churches are Trapped Forever in IRS web of deception

The following testimony was given in federal court in Tampa, Florida on January 22, 2001 by an IRS agent that churches have all fallen into the trap of the Internal Revenue Service tax exempt scheme and there is no way out. Pastors, read it and weep.

IRS agent Melvin Blough testified in federal court today (January 22, 2001) that once a church obtains the status of 501(c)(3) under the IRS code, they are trapped. The only way to be removed from a 501(c)(3) status is if the IRS chooses to remove the status. So if you dissolve the corporation and continue on as ABC church an unincorporated church, you're still trapped in their web and under their control.

Further, the agent testified that a church is automatically exempt under Federal Law without a 501(c)(3) designation. He further stated under oath that churches request the status just to get the government's stamp of approval. (Source: Art Northrup, Jr. – e-mail Art@Trellis.net).

The Indianapolis Baptist Temple experienced this first-hand. Even though we gave up all claims to our tax-exempt status in 1986, the IRS treated us as if all that we did in this respect never happened. They then officially announced that our tax-exemption had been removed in May 1995, which was carried on the front page of the Indianapolis Star and all of the TV stations in the city.

Even if a church reorganizes and changes its name or a new church organizes they are still considered IRS state churches under 508(c) of the IRC. However, this issue has never been settled in the courts, and if a church will organize properly using the Declaration of Trust, which Attorney Al Cunningham devised in 1986, they still may prevail if attacked. However we must not organize our churches in order to escape the ire of the IRS; we must do it to please God and to escape His wrath.

Pastor's Summit on Religious Liberty Says "Churches Can Own Nothing"

Sharpesburg, GA – Jan. 20-21, 2003

Approximately 30 pastors and Evangelists met in Sharpesburg, Georgia for a Pastors Summit on Religious Liberty January 20-21, 2003, moderated by this editor. After nearly two days of intense study and debate which included Attorney Al Cunningham of the Biblical Law Center of Montgomery Creek, California and other legal experts on the subject of asset protection the following conclusions were reached, and their joint statement is as follows.

In light of the present political and legal climate in the United States we make the following recommendations to the churches of America.

1. The Lord's church as found and defined in the New Testament of the King James Bible cannot be a legal entity as defined by the Internal Revenue Service in IRS Publication 1828 and created under state law such as a corporation, trust, unincorporated association, or corporation sole. However, the Lord's church has the right to lawfully exist under our Constitution without fear of having its mission or message from and for the Lord Jesus Christ from being hindered and experiencing reprisals by various governmental agencies including the Internal Revenue Service. But that right has now been stripped from it by repressive government, and corrupt courts that have upheld the IRS in their war against the gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ and a lax Congress that has abdicated their fiduciary responsibilities of oversight and control of this and other out of control bureaucracies. *Matt. 28:18-20; Mark 16:15*

2. The Lord's church is a living organism with living members and it has a living Head the Lord Jesus Christ who founded his local, visible body the church while on earth. He purchased it with His own blood before the foundations of the world, and he alone commissioned it and sustains it by the power of the Holy Spirit. It consists of those who have believed on the Lord Jesus Christ and have been baptized by immersion into that local body.

3. A pastor is to lead the flock of God according to the Holy Scriptures and not by the rules and regulations of government agencies including IRS Publication 517.

4. The Lord's church as found in the New Testament is independent and autonomous of all earthly powers, religious or civil, and is to follow their pastor as the under shepherd as he follows the Lord Jesus Christ.

5. The Lord's church should hold nothing in its own name real or personal.

This position has been confirmed by two constitutional law firms that specialize in defending churches against state encroachment. The Biblical Law Center of Montgomery Creek, California has taken this position since the early eighties. And Zachary S. Gray, an Attorney for The Christian Law Association also confirmed this idea in a letter to Dr. Greg Dixon on Gibbs & Craze Law Firm stationary dated May 8, 1998 in which he said, "To free the Lord's church completely from government entanglement, the church needs to divest itself of all of its property, both real and personal. It should not buy or hold anything in the name of the church. It should not have a bank account of any type. If a meeting place is rented, it should be rented in the name of an individual, not in the name of the church."

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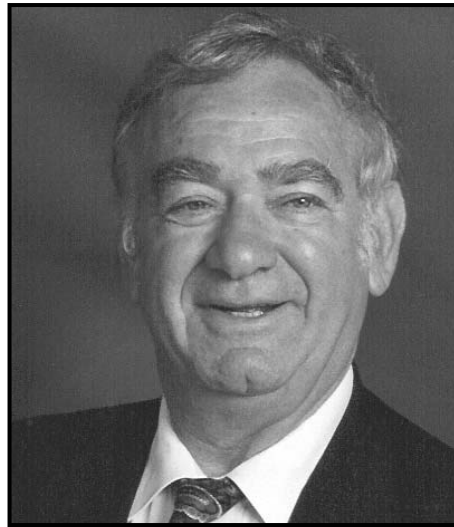
“Doc” Wolfe's E-mail Returned

It came back. “Doc”wolfe@fountainoftruth.com came back. Considering that I am barely able to turn a computer on, I get e-mails back all of the time for various reasons. In fact sometimes they come back, and nearly jump off of the screen, with language that I wouldn't want my wife to see or any decent person to hear. But this one just came back for no reason, although an e-mail wasn't sent to that address alone, it was just one of many that went out to a select list. And then I realized that someone had already shut down Dr. David L. “Doc” Wolfe's e-mail address because, obviously, he won't be needing it any more. Brother Wolfe, one of the most precious and godly men that I have ever known, was called home to be with Jesus on October 14. He is now with his lovely Savior that he told Marilyn, his dear wife of fifty years, he wanted to see, along with his Jewish mother and father whom he had reached for Christ while just a child. It's an amazing story, worthy of those narratives that you read in books or that you hear on *Unshackled*.

“Doc” had always wanted to see Jesus, but it intensified over the past few days before he died at the oh-too-young age of 68. He had inoperable lung cancer. It was the kind of tumor that doctors say non-smoking men and women get. He was in between hospital stays, those days that the visiting nurses come to the home. The pain was nearly unbearable, but the thing that made it bearable was knowing that as he suffered, he was a partaker of the sufferings of Christ and that when Christ appears, he will be glad with exceeding joy. The funeral service was held two days later at the church auditorium where he had preached so many powerful sermons.

Who can deny the providence of God in a 12-year-old boy's life, growing up in a Jewish home in St. Paul, Minnesota, when his Jewish mother asked a neighbor lady if she could send her boys with the lady's boys to the Bible camp at the Gladstone Baptist

Church down the street. Brother David was gloriously saved that day and was instrumental in reaching his entire family for Christ. His maternal grandmother had the traditional funeral for his mother, who had left Judaism for Christ. Bro. David was called to preach a year later. He met his beloved Marilyn at the Golden Rule Department store, now Donnelson's, in St. Paul, and they began going to a Baptist church where she was saved. From there they burned their bridges and went to Pilsbury Baptist Bible College where he graduated in 1962. While there, he pastored the

Wasioja Baptist Church in Wasioja and Grace Baptist Church in Titonka, Iowa for four years.

Brother Wolfe was greatly influenced by Evangelist Monroe Parker. In fact, the first time that I remember meeting David was at a citywide revival meeting in Indianapolis in the sixties that was sponsored by most of the fundamental Baptist churches of the area, with Dr. Parker as the evangelist. Brother David traveled for several years as an evangelist where he preached at camps, churches and colleges, including Tennessee Temple University. He was extremely talented as a musician, singer and ventriloquist, as well as an effective preacher of the Gospel. He also conducted a nationwide radio broadcast called "Christ Is The Answer."

Then God called him to start a church in Rochester, New York, which

was called Gates Baptist Temple when there were only two or three non-denominational Baptist churches in the state. He saw over 700 in attendance on their highest day and started a bus ministry, a Christian School, day care, camp and two radio stations. He conducted The Fountain of Truth Radio program Monday-Friday for many years which went nationwide over the Genesis network. Besides being a college graduate Brother David had a master's degree, two earned doctorates and an honorary doctorate, and he wrote four books.

May it be forever known by those who knew and loved him that he was faithful to Christ in his generation. He loved God with all of his heart and stood boldly against evil in all of its forms, including worldliness, apostasy, compromise and false doctrine of all kinds. He was a fierce public opponent of communism, socialism, modernism and ecumenism. He was unashamedly a patriotic American and a great preacher and evangelist. He knew his Bible; he was no lightweight or pantywaist. He loved missions and gave of himself and his resources to house a Ukrainian congregation of nearly one hundred in the Gates Baptist facilities. He also loved the Lord's church. He was one of the first to embrace the truths of the unregistered church movement, and did his best to untangle his church from the clutches of state tyranny, fighting with local bureaucrats with all of the resources that he had. All who knew him will miss his sweet spirit, kind and loving counsel and of course his humor that never ran out of new and funny stories, not jokes.

Dr. Wolfe was born on December 28, 1935. Besides his wife Marilyn, he is survived by his daughter Barbie Nocito and her husband John, who is a deacon at the First Baptist Church of Hammond, Indiana; and a son Dan who is the Media Coordinator for First Baptist, edits the Christian Womanhood Publications, and is the Special Events Director at Hyles-Anderson College. “Doc” also leaves a great legacy to the Christian faith to his nine grandchildren.

must admit that it was a strange feeling, almost eerie, but it's all right; something far better is going to happen one of these days.... "Doc" Wolfe himself is going to return.
